a. Adults and Dislocated Workers - Proposals approval

Mrs. Jesenia Colón Calixto presents the proposals received electronically for the Adults and Dislocated Workers Program Guides. Fifty one proposals were received, and the Proposal Evaluation Link Committee evaluated all of them: of fifty one proposals received, two proposals did not comply with the established criteria in the Guidelines. Twenty five proposals that obtained a score between 71% to 100% are recommended. Twenty four proposals received that obtained a score between 70% to 0% were not recommended.
